In 1981, with the passage of the Nursing Home Reform Law, a baseline for quality of life and quality of care was established for all nursing home residents. We, here at Park Village, work hard to ensure that our Residents’ rights are honored and strive to go above and beyond these basic expectations.

This month also allows us to reflect on the strides long-term care has taken over the past few decades. As Park Village has been family owned and operated since 1952, we have grown and developed along with many of these changes. We believe that our organization was founded on and continues to function in accordance with the beliefs that are expected and enumerated in the Residents’ Bill of Rights. A copy of this document is provided to all new residents upon admission and all new employees at orientation.
