Because of the relatively mild winter we were fortunate enough to enjoy, we have been able to maintain our desired construction schedule and are still targeting an opening date of November 1, 2016. Our facility is 100%

under roof, so even on bad weather days, we are still making significant progress.

The new facility will feature a 40-unit skilled rehab facility and a 72-unit Assisted Living facility. Among the highlights of the 13.5 acre campus are a state-of-the-art theater, two fully functional and modern kitchens, a courtyard complete with an open-air walkway, and an ultra-modern lobby area. Also, the campus is configured to accommodate seven duplex cottages slated for construction in the near future.
