This spring also brings some new features to Park Village. During the months of April and May, we are converting over to our own privately managed phone system. This will ensure better service and one consistent monthly rate for all residents.

Secondly, we will become technologically advanced with the introduction of an EMR System. Point Click Care is a common name in

our industry, specializing in providing electronic medical records for long-term care facilities like ours.

As we look forward to new beginnings in the spring time, we would like to update you on the progress of our new facility currently under construction on the south side of New Philadelphia (located at 1019 Oldtown Valley Road).

Because of the relatively mild winter we were fortunate enough to enjoy, we have been able to maintain our desired construction schedule and are still targeting an opening date of November 1, 2016. Our facility is 100%

under roof, so even on bad weather days, we are still making significant progress.

The new facility will feature a 40-unit skilled rehab facility and a 72-unit Assisted Living facility. Among the highlights of the 13.5 acre campus are a state-of-the-art theater, two fully functional and modern kitchens, a courtyard complete with an open-air walkway, and an ultra-modern lobby area. Also, the campus is configured to accommodate seven duplex cottages slated for construction in the near future.
